

The Mediapolis City Council met in regular session on 10/22/18. Mayor Protem Massner called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM. Present – Doyle, Massner, Licko, Kerr, and Garrison. Absent – Riherd. Visitors – Jessica Cary, Kim Earnest, Kathryn Harman, Jay Brady, Vollie Rifner, and Meredith Hinson.

Motion by Licko seconded by Doyle to approve the agenda as printed. All ayes.

Motion by Doyle seconded by Licko to approve the Consent Agenda – Minute, Expenses, Clerk, Library, and Water Reports. Approve a Building Permit for a Garage at 601 N. Division St. for Bud Doty. All ayes. Motion by Licko seconded by Kerr to approve Clara’s Garden Class B Native Wine Permit and Site Plan Drawing. All ayes.

No Public Comments

Stanley Consultants present to provide an update on the Lagoon Project. Site pipping was ordered on 10/9 and will be shipped on 10/29. Booster Compressor is scheduled to ship on 10/30. Pre-filter was ordered and shipped on 10/19 with an estimated arrival of 10/26. Estimated start-up date is the week of November 19th. Council has requested a progress meeting with Stanley and FYE for later this week to get an updated timeline and a plan for accountability.

Motion by Licko seconded by Kerr to set the residential refuse rate at \$13.90 a month. Ayes: Licko, Kerr, and Massner. Nays: Doyle and Garrison

Motion by Garrison seconded by Licko to approve **Resolution 20-2018 a Contract for Municipal Solid Waste Disposal with LaVeine Sanitation.** Ayes: Licko, Kerr, and Massner. Nays: Doyle and Garrison. Each resident will receive a 95-gallon trash can. If residents are wanting a 65-gallon can instead, they will need to notify the City by November 20th. After November 20th the resident will need to contact LaVeine for a 65-gallon can. A 65 and 95-gallon trash can are available at City Hall for viewing. Garbage will be picked up on Wednesday’s starting December 5th. More info will be provided to citizens later in the month.

Garrison introduced Ordinance 340. This will replace Title 6 of the Mediapolis Municipal Code dealing with animals, both domestic, wild, and dangerous and does find that the entire Title should be replaced to deal more effectively and efficiently with the issues presented to the City and to better protect and maintain the safety of its citizens. The motion to approve the first reading was seconded by Licko and approved by a unanimous roll call vote.
