

The Mediapolis City Council met in regular session on 9/24/18. Mayor Riherd called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM. Present – Doyle, Massner, Licko, Kerr, and Garrison. Visitors – Vollie Rifner, Jay Brady, Kirk Brown, and Lieutenant Williams.

Motion by Licko seconded by Doyle to approve the agenda as printed. All ayes.

Motion by Licko seconded by Kerr to approve the Consent Agenda – Minutes, Expenses, Clerk, Library and Water Reports. Approve a Building Permit for a Storage Shed at 304 N. Washington St. for Greg Gerst. All ayes.

No Public Comments

Motion by Licko seconded by Kerr to table Lagoon Project Update.

Council reviewed Animal Ordinance recommendations from the City Attorney. Motion by Doyle seconded by Licko to update Animal Ordinance recommendations regarding wrong numbering, the definition of “Animal,” and the Confinement of animals. Council requested further review of the Dangerous Animals section and to have Dr. Thomas’ recommendations forwarded to the City Attorney and to gather additional clarification on Seizure, Impoundment, and Disposition. All ayes.

Brady and Brown presented the Council with a Lagoon Project Update. FYE has everything needed to start work onsite minus the relief valve and one small sensor which will be on site by next week. Brown will be working with FYE to take measurements on the piping which will be shipped out by the end of the week. FYE plans to be on site next week to begin the installation. The Oxygen Booster is scheduled to be here by the middle of October, this is not needed for initial operation of the Lagoon. The Booster will be installed once it arrives, allowing the machine to run at higher pressures. Brady is going to schedule a meeting with IDNR in Mid-October for a progress update. Massner asked Brown to produce a checklist of punch items needing to be done at the Lagoon for the operation of the NAN02 and to update council as items are being checked off.

Council reviewed refuse recommendation from the Subcommittee. The Subcommittee has asked for the Council to give approval for the Mayor to go into negotiations with the bidder for additional information. Motion by Doyle seconded by Licko to allow the Mayor to go into negotiation with the bidder and to obtain additional information for the Council’s further review. All ayes.

Motion by Doyle seconded by Licko to send a Municipal Infraction of \$50.00 to 11-2018. All ayes. Motion by Massner seconded by Licko to send a Progress Letter containing recommendations on how to further remove trash to 12-2018. All ayes. Motion by Garrison seconded by Doyle to abate 13-2018. All ayes.
